


Proper Preface

Proclamation of Christ


As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

Robert C. Preece

The Rev. Dr. Robert C. Preece, senior pastor at Zion Lutheran Church and School in Dallas, Texas, was born on July 3, 1947, at St. David's Hospital, Austin, and raised in Travis County. He accepted Zion's divine call to serve in 1990, having served the previous 17 years at Immanuel Lutheran Church, Waterloo, Illinois (metro St. Louis). A 1973 graduate of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, he earned the Doctor of Ministry degree in 1981 at Drew University in Madison, New Jersey. Pastor



Robert and his wife Linda have two sons, Justin (married to Cindy) and Matthew (married to Jenny), and three grandsons, Owen, Andrew, and Luke.

His wife, Linda Jean née Lege Preece, was director of Endowment Giving for Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas, serving for 22 years at SMU. A professional musician, she contributed her talents at Zion as soloist, choir member, and director of the Women's Choir. She also served on various Zion committees and projects. From 1973 to 1990 she worked in the Music and Art Departments of Concordia Publishing House in St. Louis, Missouri.

Following his installation as Zion's senior pastor, Robert initiated and led the parish in two successful capital campaigns for the elimination of remaining debt on the 1982 church and administrative office buildings, as anticipated by Zion leadership,



with the subsequent Burning of the Mortgage in December 2002. Over the past two decades, the parish has undergone major improvements to its facilities, including reconstructing the parking area and expanding various pastoral services. The Boldly Building Zion Ministry Campaign (BBZM) efforts included three more capital campaigns, which provided for the music rehearsal hall, three middle school classrooms, a conference room, and school administrative facilities. In August 2023, the \$6.1 million recreation outreach center (ROC) was dedicated.

In 2022-2023 Robert was privileged to work as the bishop for the vicar and ministerial candidate Christopher D. Knepper of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.

As part of Zion's active mission, ministry, and mercy-showing, Preece has led work and teaching trips to sister parishes in Guadalajara, Monterrey, and Mexico City, Mexico. He journeyed with Linda on teaching, preaching, and learning missions to countries throughout the world, including Africa, Europe and India. He traveled to Cuba to participate in building Lutheran churches; served in Kisumu, Kenya, at the non-profit mission Ndoto, and in Nairobi, Kenya, at a vision clinic with his son Justin, helping people both to see better and to see Jesus as their Lord and Savior. Domestically, he organized and participated in Zion mission trips, "Run, Pony, Run," to the Gulf Coast region to assist with recovery from Hurricanes Katrina, Rita, Ike, and others. Rehabilitation and relief work was also offered in Texas and New Mexico.

In the larger church, from 2000–2012 Pastor Preece was vice president of the Texas District–LCMS, Area B, serving 110 parishes in North Texas, the last six of those years as first vice president. He had an initiating role in the formation of the Lutheran Intercity Network Coalition (LINC) of North Texas and was also honored to serve on the board of directors for Lutheran Social Services of the South (1999-2008). He is currently on the board of directors for the American Luther Research Center and the Dallas Bach Society. For 30 years he has participated in the Dallas/Ft. Worth Lutheran Hymn Festival Committee, serving as chair for several terms.

Pastor Preece still drives the '53 Ford ("the gray ghost"). He began playing competitive baseball in 1956 and played competitive slow-pitch softball until March 12, 2020, for a 64-year run until Covid-19 closed the diamonds down. (Humbly, said he, on that day he was the winning pitcher and two for three at the plate.)



With loving gratitude and deep regard for the parishioners, ministerial crew, faculty, staff, janitors, architects, construction workers, and contractors engaged and worked with at Immanuel Lutheran Church, Waterloo, Illinois, and at Zion Lutheran Church and School, Dallas, Texas, Robert and Linda say, "Thank you!"

His dearest Linda was diagnosed with Alzheimer's in 2018. "For better for worse, in sickness and in health," he has sought to be her faithful primary caregiver, in reality doing so over the past seven years. She currently lives at Arden Courts Memory Care Center a mile from their home in Richardson. He is with her and helps her twice every day, morning and night. *Kyrie Eleison, Christe Eleison, Kyrie Eleison*.
